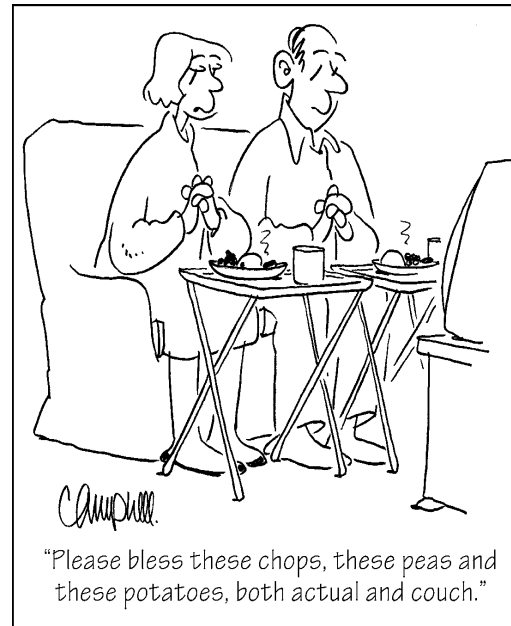

Be a Good Samaritan and Help Samaritan's Purse

Operation Christmas Child ships carefully packaged Christmas gifts throughout the world to needy children. It is coordinated by the Samaritan's Purse, which is overseen by Franklin Graham, son of Billy Graham. If you would like to participate, boxes will be available at the church to fill with toys, school supplies, and hygiene items, or other things such as sunglasses, flashlights with extra batteries, caps, socks, T-shirts, toy jewelry, hair clips, watches, or small picture books. Boxes should not include war-related toys, perishable food items, liquids, medicines or vitamins, breakable items, or used items. Each box should contain items for only a boy or a girl in these age categories: 2-4 years old, 5-9 years old, or 10-14 years old. A five dollar check for shipping needs to be made out to Samaritan's Purse (write a note on the memo line for Operation Christmas Child) and placed in an envelope on top of your gift items inside your box. A form listing the age and sex of the child should be filled out and taped on the top of your box. Finally, place a rubber band around your box and lid. Boxes are due to the church office no later than Sunday, November 14.

Business Meeting 10/10/04

Meeting opened in prayer by Bill Schoggen with 33 present.

Reports

Sunday School reported 104 average attendance in September with six visitors. Sunday School is taking the lead in a new outreach ministry. Information meeting set for Tuesday, Oct. 19 at 7pm. All Sunday School teachers were given an announcement for their classes today.

Wednesday Night Dinners reported they served 167 meals at four dinners. That is an average of 42 meals at each dinner. They received \$498.00. They spent \$569.30 for food and supplies. Expenses were a little more than usual because of re-starting the program after summer break and the type of meals served. Ending balance is \$522.86.

Nominating Committee announced two contacts for two adult Sunday School classes that had no teacher/contact person last business meeting. The contact person for the couples class is Rod Gunther, the contact person for the Mixed-3 class is Harvey Lawson.

Property Committee announced the cost for utilities, custodian/lawn care and maintenance for the month of September. Utilities were \$1,727.93, custodian/lawn care was \$2,621.08 and maintenance was \$4,015.80. Property Chair Dave Patton pointed out that there are several major repairs coming up soon such as roofing of the old building.

Treasurer handed out his report. The format and look of the report is different because it is directly from Quickbooks. The CPA was in the office this week helping fine tune Quickbooks

Questions

(Q) On the Balance Sheet is it necessary to list all assets fixed and other wise, i.e.; land and building?

(A) The CPA would not do an incomplete income statement so a listing of the assets was necessary. In the April business meeting it was brought forward that an income statement was to be part of the treasurer's report. (Moderator's note: congregation voted during the April meeting to include an income statement in monthly Treasurer's report which by standard practice would include an asset and liability statement.)

The missions funds accounts are still not reconciled but Owen is working on it. The amount on the Income Statement for BB&T credit cards needs to be itemized. Every month when the statement comes in it is up to the card holder to detail the expenses and that takes time.

(Q) Is the business with the CPA going well?

(A) The CPA has completed his work. The church approved \$1,000. and the CPA agreed with that amount. He is still available for questions.

Jerilyn Schoggen reported that 17 women are going on the Women's Retreat at Eagle Eyre on November 6-7.

Church Council reported that they went through the list of suggestions that were expressed during the evening service on October 3, 2004, to expand and improve our church and its mission. Four of the suggestions were taken up for action now. The other suggestions are being discussed with appropriate com-

mittee chairpersons for possible action now or in the near future.

1. Sunday School is taking the lead in reviving the visitation program.

2. Music director and Pastor have scheduled December 26 as a joint worship service combining the 8:45am and 11am services. This joint service is being planned to include a lot of singing and fellowship to reacquaint the two groups

3. Suzanne Buckingham has offered to take the lead in having a children's sermon in the early service. For now it will be only a sermon and the children will not be leaving worship for extended care.

4. The office manager, Rebecca Thomas, is working on a new church phone list and will include street and email addresses.

Nancy Twitchell has offered to give flu shots to the seniors of the church. The church council voted to add a medical rider to the insurance policy which will cost \$100 per year. Nancy will announce a date and time to administer the shots and establish a cost per person.

Nominating Committee brought forward nominations for the upcoming year. Substitute teachers: Mark and Rebecca Thomas (Children); Linda Williams (Kindergarten); Suzanne Buckingham (Youth); Preschool Director: Pat Heflin. All names passed unanimously.

if we truly knew GOD personally; in His personal attributes that He has disclosed for us in Scripture. We were forced to see if our conception of GOD matched who He really is. I shared the communicable or moral attributes of GOD (the ones He also commands us to strive for) and compared them to a tree. As I described GOD, the youth interactively created the tree analogy. Two people were the two taproots of the tree: holiness and love. The branches coming from the holiness taproot were: purity, truth, righteous/just, wrath. The branches coming from the love taproot were: goodness, grace, mercy, hesed (a Hebrew word that can't be fully described in this brief article). Each youth participated to form 'the tree of GOD's moral attributes' so our perception of GOD could be true. With a correct perception of CREATOR GOD and an understanding of theology proper, we found a better perception of us, as His creation as well as His commanded and modeled pattern for our daily lives. What a blast!

MAKE A TABLE LANTERN

Make this candleholder to decorate your family's

Thanksgiving dinner table.

What you need:


- Tiny leaves
- Glue
- Small glass jar with a wide mouth (salsa jars work great)
- Colored tissue paper (use fall colors if you can)
- Paintbrush
- Small votive candle

How to make it:

1. Collect tiny autumn leaves.
2. Glue the leaves to the outside of the jar.
3. Tear tissue paper into small pieces.
4. Use the paintbrush to cover the outside of the jar (including the leaves) with glue. Work on small parts of the jar at a time.
5. Lightly press the tissue paper pieces onto the glue until the entire outside of the jar is covered.
6. When the jar is completely dry, place the candle inside.
7. Ask an adult to light the candle during Thanksgiving dinner.
